Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2012-2013 educational progress for Lakeland Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Sean LaRosa for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site <http://www.pinckneyschools.org/index.php/departments/instructional/annual-education-reports> or you may review a copy in the principal's office at your child's school.

The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Our school has not been identified as a Reward School, Focus School or Priority School.

Results from our students' Fall, 2012 to Spring, 2013 performance on the nationally normed Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments indicate that 82.5%, 88.1%, and 89% of our second, third and fourth grade students are proficient in Reading. In addition 76.2%, 74.6%, and 84.1% of our second, third and fourth grade students are proficient in Mathematics. Our key challenges are meeting the needs of all students and providing high quality, research-based interventions for our students who are not yet proficient, particularly in the area of Mathematics. Our school has been utilizing the Instructional Consultation Team process for six years, and will be implementing a structured Response to Intervention model during the 2013-14 school year.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Students are assigned to schools by the geographic location of their residence or by school of choice requests by parents/guardians that are approved when classroom space is available.

2. With the new state requirements for reporting school improvement, we are in year three of a three-year cycle of school improvement cycle.
3. Pinckney Community Schools' website contains information about our curriculum. Follow the "About" menu to the "Departments" menu item and select the "Instruction and Assessment" link. Pinckney Community Schools adheres to the Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics.
4. For the 2012-2013 school year, 50% of 4th grade students were proficient in Mathematics, 80% were proficient in Reading and 66% were proficient in Writing as measured by the MEAP. In the 2011-2012 school year 36% of 4th graders were proficient in Mathematics, 72% in Reading and 51% in Writing. In the 2012-2013 school year, 33% of 3rd graders were proficient in Mathematics, and 79% were proficient in Reading as measured by the MEAP. For the 2010-2011 school year, 32% of 3rd graders were proficient in Mathematics and 79% were proficient in Reading.
5. 100%, or 342 Lakeland Elementary students, were represented at Parent Teacher Conferences in 2012-2013. In the 2011-2012 school year, 100%, or 368, students were represented at Parent Teacher Conferences.

For 2012-2013 school year, Lakeland Elementary School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English Language Arts and Mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.
